EDSON & TALENT

Life Child is one of the social justice expressions of Life Church in Africa. Meet one of our Life Church/Life Child Pastors who are intentional and dedicated to making a difference in their community.

Edson and Talent were born in Zimbabwe in 1981 and 1985, respectively; after completing High School, Edson joined the military, working in the Department of Army Finance as a finance clerk until he resigned after ten years of Service. During his time of service in the army, he met Talent, who was then working in the Ministry of Higher and Tertiary Education as an Examinations clerk. After they married, Edson resigned to pursue his tertiary education studying Business Management at the University of Zimbabwe. Talent enrolled as a student nurse at Parirenyatwa Hospital Nursing School. It was during the year 2008 that Zimbabwe suffered one of the worst economic downturns ever to be recorded in history.

Edson then left for South Africa as an economic refugee, later joined by Talent and their first-born son Darryl six months later. Edson got saved at Life Church Sea Point in 2009, and the family joined a cell group in the church. That marked the beginning of their spiritual development and growth through cell training, serving in the local church, leadership development courses, and discipleship. After a while, the family became cell leaders and then zone supervisors after multiplying their cell groups. In 2013, both were employed by Life Church, which helped them intensify their ministry training. They both attended two years of Leaders in Future Training (LIFT) run by the Assemblies of God (AOG). After that, they studied and obtained a Diploma in Ministry course through the Christian Leaders Institute based in America.

In 2017, they were sent by the leadership of Life Church and the AOG to go plant Life Church in Zimbabwe. Since then, they have been serving in Harare, where they planted Life Church, and have been actively involved in raising and discipling future leaders and equipping both the young and adults with different life skills. They firmly believe that the gospel has the power to restore hope even in a difficult country like Zimbabwe, one life at a time.

Life Church and Life Child Zimbabwe are actively involved in strengthening several high-need families. They are preparing to open a Life Child ECD focused on Montessori-styled education for vulnerable and orphaned children as part of the holistic expression of Life Church in the community of Domboshava.

SEWING PROJECTS

We have established a micro-business of commercial clothing production in Mozambique to help sustain our ongoing work of Life Child in our community and create employment opportunities and skills training to help through economic strengthening to keep families together.

Many people in the community need more resources or educational skills to address their needs independently. There is little intervention at the government level. As a result, there is a significant stress on families staying together.

Through this commercial sewing project, we can employ and train a team to operate the industrial and electrical sewing machines donated through our partnership with Dignidad NGO from Spain for income generation locally, regionally, and in the future through foreign export to create income for Life Child projects.

MORINGA FARM


Life Business, regarding the Moringa Farm in Mozambique, has expanded its infrastructures by investing in a well for fresh water on site, a guard's house, a small storage facility, and frontal fencing. The section of cleared land is 20 hectares. However, severe flooding due to cyclones has been a real challenge to the low-lying parts of the farm, where plant loss has been visible. Work continues for corrections as strategies continue to be forged in moving forward.








activities included a sponsor run, bake sale, and charity auction.

TRAINING



Houston's First Baptist Church

Mary Ring from Houston's First Baptist Church came to Cape Town to upskill our Life Church and Life Child parents, staff, and individuals from our surrounding community on how to deal with vulnerable children and trauma. Mary presented a 2-day Parenting Course on creating better regulation and interpersonal relationships between parents/caregivers and their children.

Our Life Child staff also had the opportunity to spend another two days with Mary, where she trained the team on using attachment/trauma play groups to build healthy and healing connections with the children in our care. We are forever grateful for her wisdom, time, and investment in our communities, which will have a generational impact. Lamb International

In August, Lamb International ran a very informative one-week Master Training. They trained two trauma trainers for Life Child, one from Mozambique and one from Cape Town. This was to help equip them to train the Life Child staff and the community. This was valuable as many children and families in our communities face heavy trauma. Life Child is committed to seeing lives restored.

MOZAMBIQUE —Adalaide

Adalaide is a student at our Life Child Peace School in Mozambique. She entered school with many traumas and with a lot of family vulnerability. Still, over the years, she learned from her teachers in the cell (discipleship) group about the love of Jesus and how Jesus changes our lives and perspectives. It was not easy for her at first. However, as she learned and prayed with her teachers the previous year, even amid the pandemic, she decided to surrender her life to Jesus Christ, accepting him as her Lord and Saviour. Excitingly, she publicly testified her faith in Jesus Christ through water baptism.

Today, Adalaide no longer feels alone and abandoned but believes that God is her Father and cares for her and her family. Her family is highly vulnerable; they have no home of their own, and they live by renting houses from people of good faith in the community; her mother works hard as a subsistence farmer. Adalaide is a joyful girl whose life has been forever transformed.





MALAWI Milika

Milika, aged four, stays with her parents and three other siblings; she is the last born. The family struggles financially and depends on piecework to make ends meet. As the income is unstable, it doesn't sustain their basic needs. Milika loves reading, Arts, and ball play. She is also part of a cell and is being nurtured spiritually. In terms of food, she loves porridge. Milika joined the Moyo Preschool in Malawi in January 2022, and we have seen a massive transformation in her life.

Through our routine home visits, we also visited her home, only to find that they were not spared from the damage caused by Cyclone Ana which hit Malawi in January. We found that their house fell to one side, and they had to source for temporary measures to fix the house. Luckily a good Samaritan borrowed them used Iron sheets. At the time of our visit, they were due to be returned to the owner, and they had nothing to use as a replacement.

Through the local church, we managed to get another temporary fix by supplying them with black sheets to cover the affected area, as a permanent solution was being sourced. In addition, they were given an extra blanket that was also in short supply in their home. They are so thankful to God for the support they received. "We are so thankful for the timely support given to us; God should richly bless you," the mother said.



SOUTH AFRICA Princess

Little Princess joined the Life Child Preschool in February 2022 as a two and a 1/2-year-old just out of diapers and the tiniest tot in the class. There has been a remarkable change in the family since she joined our preschool. Princess integrated into school life quickly. She is a softly-spoken little girl and smiles a lot. She has great learning potential and is taking steps in this direction, retelling everything she did at school to her family when she gets home, including singing new songs for her household.

The home situation is a challenging one. Princess's mother, Phumeza, is sharing the home with her sister Lindiswe who has a medical condition where the nerves in her feet are dead, which makes it challenging to work. Five years ago, their third sister in the Eastern Cape passed away, and they took in her two 'motherless' children to live with them. The family of five lives off R1350, which is three Social Grants, in a two-roomed shack home.

When Princess's 20-year-old cousin in the Eastern Cape was beaten to death, Life Child offered to counsel Phumeza as she was grief-stricken. We also invited her sister to join the Parent Workshops, which could assist her in raising her nieces. Life Child also helped with some toiletries and a food parcel.

Despite the family challenges, Phumeza did not take the opportunities presented by Life Child lightly. She had previously kept busy offering her time at Siqalo Creche in Kosovo, cleaning, engaging with the children, and enjoying the classroom environment. When Princess joined the Life Child Preschool, she volunteered to clean and showed a keen interest in 'teaching.' When the school needed a relief teacher for a month, Phumeza was the obvious choice, and the preschool could employ her as a stand-in. We are thankful for Phumeza and her family and trusting God for a wonderful unfolding of His plan for them all.






ZIMBABWE Meltina

Meltina Jofiles is a widow who lives with her three children and grandson in a one-room cabin in the high-density suburb of Dzivaresekwa. Her husband passed away ten years ago, and she has been struggling to look after her children as a widow since then. Besides all the hardships, she has been doing odd jobs, which enabled her to provide the little she could, although it was not enough. Meltina's husband was a tailor, so before he died, he taught her the basics of sewing, which has been extremely helpful for her.

When Meltina and her family joined Life Child, she testified that her family's life had changed because she was now hopeful. The lessons she has learned have helped her approach life differently. She is grateful that the food parcels she receives every month can supplement the little she can afford. Out of everything, she benefits from the program; she is happy that her children can now attend school like other children without being sent home for non-payment of school fees, as Life Child has been paying them. She testifies that she is a better mother because of the parenting skills she has learned from Life Child. This has strengthened them as a family.

Since her husband died, Meltina has been hand sewing clothes for selling, helping them as a family. Because she is already gifted, Life Child provided a sewing machine for Meltina, which will help her with her sewing and hopefully increase the family's income. Meltina is so excited about what God will do through the sewing machine and believes that the future looks promising and that income will be generated through the sewing machine.



LOCKING AHEAD

Our project initiatives focus on building firm foundations within our four focus areas. We are currently at maximum capacity with our current infrastructures, and the construction of these new projects will enable us to continue on the journey of transformation:

- Additional classrooms at the Peace School in Mozambique, which is currently a full primary school (Grades 1-6) in Mozambique. Life Child has a vision to build a secondary school, enabling us to enroll our children from Grades 1-12.
- A new building for our Moyo ECD in Malawi (in the picture): The existing
 Montessori ECD is rented and will be transferred to a new Life Child-owned building.
- 3. A new Montessori ECD in Chimoio, Mozambique: with children 3-5 years old, totalling 60 children.
- 4. The purchasing of land for a new Montessori ECD in Zimbabwe: 3-5 years old, totalling 60 children.
- 5. Classrooms at the Okalawo Village in Mozambique, which is currently a full primary school (Grades 1-6) in Mozambique. Life Child has a vision to build a secondary school, enabling us to enroll our children from Grades 1-12.

With several cyclones severely hitting Mozambique over the last few years, we have had assistance from structural engineers to review the damage, make recommendations on infrastructure improvements, and reconstruct our buildings and community homes resiliently.

Our building projects are facilitating not just infrastructure, but we are building into the lives of our children, their families, and the communities for generational change, one life at a time.
